YGH Celebrates its Fifth Anniversary Art, Community and a Gala Evening

November 30 was a gala evening for the Yorklands Green hub. It was a celebration of the closing night of Artspiration 2018, a month-long show and auction of beautiful work donated by local artists to benefit Yorklands Green Hub's work and vision. It was also a lively gathering of members, volunteers, artists and supporters, who came to 10C Shared Space to celebrate YGH's fifth anniversary, a success story of collaboration that's kept its unique vision alive and flourishing.

Since 2013, when YGH first put forth the idea of repurposing 70 acres and a heritage building of the former Ontario Reformatory as a sustainable environments centre, that vision has inspired a remarkable outpouring of interest, ideas, and creativity. For five years, YGH has waited for the provincially-owned prison farm land to be put up for sale. Over that time, the organization has provided the impetus for an unending stream of outreach, partnerships, presentations, collaborat-

ions, charettes, pilot programs, fundraising and researching best models and sustainable ideas for a green hub for Guelph.

Building a sustainable future and mitigating climate change are the big challenges of our times. YGH's chosen focus areas - renewable energy, urban agriculture, water conservation and heritage protection - have made it a draw for citizens, academics, researchers, nature-lovers, artists and government staff who support the idea of urban sustainability as a 21st century priority.

For the Bees, the Water and the Climate Fall Enviro-Series Talks #3 and #4

The final two of YGH's four 2018 Enviro-Series talks were presented this autumn, completing offerings on our focus areas of water, energy, food and heritage.

SEPTEMBER 17TH ENVIRO-SERIES #3: WATER

Guest speaker Professor Nigel Raine of ENERGY the University of Guelph School of Environmental Science described the detrimental effects of pesticides on pollinator populations. "Roughly one in three mouthfuls of food we eat depends on the pollination services of insects," he reminded listeners. Raine explained how pesticides are affecting both the numbers and abilities of pollinators to function, citing a growing body of research supporting Health Canada's expression of concern about the consequences of pesticide use. Raine's <u>lab</u> focuses on the effects of neonicotinoid pesticides on bees in particular. His research shows that pollinators experience diminished energy and ability to search out, find and pollinate flowering vegetation in proximity to pesticide use. This impact on a critically important ecosystem service provided by pollinators is a threat to both biodiversity and our food security.

The second speaker, professor Ryan Prosser, focused on water quality, and the effects of pesticide pollution on fish and on freshwater mussels, a threatened species in the food chain. Diminished populations and size are some of the effects noted in these species that live in waters that carry pesticides from agricultural runoff. These harmful effects on fish and invertebrate species then degrade the food chains of which they are a part.

Guelph is now one of Canada's <u>Bee</u> <u>Cities</u>, committed to initiatives which will help protect our local pollinators. We are fortunate to have this strong guiding research as we confirm our intention to keep the Yorklands Green Hub site as an urban pollination park. Protecting pollinators will be part of our educational mission, with information boards along trails to increase knowledge about the importance of maintaining natural green corridors and clean waterways which support pollinator strength.

Steve Dyck, President of Guelph Solar, opened the October energy presentation with an aerial image of the

Superintendent's house on Parcel 2 of the proposed Yorklands site. He spoke of the excellent potential of restoring this heritage house as a demonstration site for reduced carbon emissions. He proposed a grid-tied net-metering project that could make the building energy self-sufficient, reduce its future energy costs, and reduce its carbon footprint. Remembrance Day Second Sunday Yorklands Walk Speedwell Hospital's Hopeful Post-WWI Legacy

Our regular Second Sunday Walks on the Blue Dot Trail have been a success in building appreciation of Guelph's Yorklands. The most recent one fell on November 11, Remembrance Day, with the walk's theme focused on the history of the site a hundred years ago.

Following World War I, the Reformatory was transformed for several years into a rehabilitation hospitalfor returning wounded and bedridden soldiers from World War I. It also served as a skills-training centre for their reintegration into civilian life.

Through regular leisurely-paced explorations, we're helping the community get to know more of the natural and built heritage of this unique place that has been part of Guelph's history for over a hundred years. The people who come out for the walks often have stories or fascinating historical details to add as we ramble among the streams, ponds, meadows and wetlands, stonework and heritage buildings of the site.

Every Second Sunday walk has a different theme, and rewards us with seasonal sightings among the flowers, trees and wildlife. Our volunteers plan to continue presenting these monthly walks starting again in February of 2019.
